<p>1. Collect stories from newspaper and magazines about everyday heroes and make a clippings board. Heroic acts might include saving people or animals from danger, fighting fires or donating organs to help another person.</p>	<p>2. Create a fact file about a real hero (past or present) that you find interesting.</p>	<p>3. Sketch a portrait of a hero from photographs or images. You could use watercolours to bring your sketch to life.</p>	<p>4. Make a collage portrait of a villainous character. Remember to use a range of different materials.</p>
<p>5. Make 'Top Trumps' cards for villains and heroes in children's stories and fairy tales. Include their name, a picture and a short description of the character on each card. Don't forget to include information on the characters' strengths, weaknesses, intelligence, fitness and any other traits you think are appropriate and fun!</p>	<p>6. Make a list of five positive things that you and your friends could do to improve your school environment. Write your ideas on 'helping hands' and decorate them beautifully.</p>	<p>7. Make a 3D hero or villain, real or fictional. You could use Lego, junk modelling, play dough or anything else you have.</p>	<p>8.
