Wroxton Primary School PE and Sports Premium Action Plan 2017/2018

What is the PE and Sports Premium?

Since September 2013, all primary schools across England have been in receipt of a PE and Sport Premium Grant. The government have guaranteed this funding until 2020. Monies must be spent on improving the provision, and quality of PE and sport, within primary school and to promote and develop a healthier lifestyle.

How we use the PE and Sport Premium at Wroxton.

For the 2017/2018 academic year, Wroxton we will receive a total of £16,850, made up in 2 parts; £9,829 received in November 2017, then the further £7,021 to be paid in May.

As part of our affiliation to the North Oxfordshire School Sports Partnership (NOSSP), we pay £7,578, again this is paid in 2 par

This affiliation gives Wroxton Church of England Primary School access to regular support from a specialist Primary PE Mentor (this year we have Mr Rory Mawn) who works with and alongside teachers, Mr Hickman, (PE Coordinator) and our teaching assistants to improve the quality and learning in, and through, PE and sports.

Our affiliation to NOSSP enables us to enter all the sports events and festivals they arrange, giving us access to inter schools competitions, National School Games events, as well as support with a development of Change4Life club, this being run by Mrs Shaw, assisted by Mr Mawn.

During this academic school year the children have participated in various Level 1 Competitions (inter class and/or year) including Rugby, Football, Running and Boccia.

At Wroxton we attempt to ensure that pupils attend as many events/festivals as possible, and we are only able to do this with the backing and support of our class teachers. As a school, during this academic year, we have attended the following events:

Triathlon for Years 3 – 6, Tag Rugby for Years 5 – 6, Cross Country Years 1 – 6, Multi-Skills Festival for Years 1 – 2, Dodgeball Festival for Years 3 – 4, Hockey Tournament for Years 5 – 6, there are further events coming up – Kwik Cricket, for our Years 5 and 6, and a Striking and Fielding Festival, for Years 3 and 4, both of which we have entered.

Additionally, as part of NOSSP, we were able to invite 2 coaches from Banbury Hockey Club to attend our school, to provide coaching for all our Year 5 and 6 pupils.

Wroxton staff are also able to attend regular meetings and conferences arranged by NOSSP to ensure we are updated with all relevant information.

On Friday 23rd March – Sports Relief Day 2018 – the whole school, from Foundation Stage to Year 6, and some staff, ran at least 1 mile, many of the older children ran further.

On June 25th we will be welcoming Elizabeth Cann, a GB Badminton player, together with a Sports for Schools Event Sportivator, who will give us all an inspirational talk, then class by class they will lead the children through a fitness circuit, as designed by the Sportivator.

After much continued hard work across the school, from teachers, staff and Mr Mawn, for all our PE and Sports achievements, for the 2017/18 academic year, we were again gained the Silver Award from The Youth Sports Trust, and for the 2016/17 year we also gained the Silver Award from the School Games Kitemark, a step up from the bronze award the previous year; looking forward to our 2017/18 application I anticipate continuing with yet another silver award.

We have had notable success this academic year, particularly in the Cross Country competition, where Elena, of the Falcons, qualified for the Oxfordshire Cross Country County Final and one of our Tag Rugby teams qualified for the semi-final of their competition. One reason for our success and continued success is preparation, ensuring our Long Term PE plan is focused on forthcoming sports events and festivals.

NOSSP affiliation provides our school with mentoring and guidance to increase the confidence in our staff in delivering high quality PE lessons, and this in turn to promote happy and healthy pupils.

To date this is how we have allocated our Sports Premium;

Coaches (all these costs are now covered by our sports premium)	£400
Hockey equipment	£267
Netball nets	£164
Rawmarsh PE Sports Scheme	£160
Drama School –for Year 5/6 students - to provide confidence	£200

Since I have been PE coordinator I set the school a challenge, to ensure that as many children as possible compete in Level 2 competitions/festivals, these are events where we compete and participate against other schools within our School Partnership, in 2015/16 we managed 89%; at the end of the 2016/17 year we managed 91%, so far for 2017/18 academic year we have reached 92%.

There is presently a full and thorough review taking place of all our current PE equipment, by myself and Mr Mawn, overseen by Mrs Guinness, with a view to assessing where additional monies can be best utilised.
